DROUGHT AFFECTS WILDLIFE

Banke National Park, southwestern Nepal is facing shortage of water in rivers and ponds that affects the wildlife habitat. This protected area is a home to twenty one tigers, and many antelopes, leopards and bears. With an area of 55000 ha, The park has only 26 artificial ponds within 550 sq. km. However, park authority aims to have at least 55 artificial ponds to provide water to wildlife.

The National Emergency Work Operation Centre of the Home Ministry indicated that the country experienced 4,282 incidents of natural disaster last year and affected 11,533 families directly causing the death of 454 people, injury of 4,188 people and property loss of around NPR 4.48 billion.

DECREASE IN NUMBER OF BENGAL FLORICAN

Bengal florican (*Houbaropsis Bengalensis*), a critically endangered large terrestrial omnivorous bird is on the verge of extinction due to habitat loss in Chitwan National Park of central Nepal. The 2011 census counted 12 Bengal florican in eastern sector of the park, however only five have been spotted in western sector recently. It is estimated that around 100 of individuals remained in Nepal most of which are found in Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve in eastern Nepal.

VEHICLES FAIL TO MEET STANDARDS

A random test conducted by Metropolitan Traffic Police Department (MTPD) in April showed that more than 41 percent of vehicles out of 51 vehicles failed to meet the emission standards. Around 40 percent of wildlife deaths are attributed to road accidents along east-west highway along the southern Nepal.

SNOW LEOPARDS FLOURISHING

Snow leopards' (*Panthera uncia*) population has been increasing in Sanjiangyuan of northwest china. Recent sceintific survey has estimated 1,000 snow leopards in the area. Similarly, other wildlife species such as brown bears (*Ursidae*) and yaks (*Bos grunniens*) have been flourishing since 2016.
