## **CAMERA TRAPPING AIDS CONSERVATION**

The poaching and smuggling of red panda has been abated through camera trapping at Mabu VDC, Ilam, eastern Nepal. Altogether five cameras were kept on tree holes, bushes, or lichen to record activities in the forest. Around 23 to 40 red pandas have been estimated in the area.

#### **BURMESE SHRIKE DISCOVERED**

The Ugyen Wangchuck Institute for Conservation and Environment (UWICE) has found a male Burmese shrike (*Lanius collurioides*) at Lamai Gonpa, Bumthang district, northern Bhutan. The bird was 17-20cm long and 26.7g in weight. It has been listed in "The IUCN Red List of Threatened Species, 2012".
