#### WEATHER STATIONS ON MOUNT EVEREST

The National Geographic Society has successfully installed five weather stations on Mt. Everest with an aim to provide real-time information about mountain conditions and climate change. These stations are located at the Balcony area (8,430 m) and South Col (7,945 m), Phortse (3,810 m), Everest Base Camp (5,315 m) and Camp II (6,464 m).

## PLANTATION ALONG ROAD SECTION OF POSTAL HIGHWAY

## **UNPRECEDENTED SNOWNFALL IN SONAMARG**

Unprecedented snowfall after 24 hours of heavy rains in Ganderbal and Badgam districts in Kashmir of north India caused low lying areas inundated by flash floods. Similarly, heavy rains in Chamba District of Himachal Pradesh in northern India also caused roads blocked with rubble. Both events destroyed farms and orchards.

## **CLIMATE CHANGE IN TIBET**

Climate change has affected the weather of southwest China's Tibet Autonomous Region, and increased the temperature by 0.33 degrees Celsius every 10 years on an average. The average temperature of this year's spring in Tibet was 5 degrees Celsius that is 0.3 degrees higher than normal years, while the average precipitation was decreased by 9.9 mm from the normal years.

## **ECOSYSTEM PROTECTION**

Northwest China's Qinghai Province launched a plan to build a long-term mechanism to protect the ecosystem on the plateau that will complete boundary surveys of nature protection areas by 2020 and build a nature protection system by 2035. Qinghai had established 217 nature reserves covering an area of 25 million ha.
